
## Exercise 6: Using P2P line to connect E2E Crosshatching


- ☐ ♠ Load a practice piece on your machine.
- ☐ <a> Open Creative Studio.</a>
- ☐ <a> Add Pattern: pats grid</a>
- ☐ <a>^</a> Measure dimensions of your quilt. For this exercise: 119" wide x 140" long

We will be using Repeat Pattern mode.


☐ ♠ Click on Repeat Pattern icon. With the freeze aspect function turned on, set height of your pattern. In this exercise the total height will be 21" (3 squares @ 7" each)




- ☐ <a>^</a> Stitch out first pattern repeat.
- $\square$   $^{}$  Roll quilt in preparation to quilt next pass. Move down and leave unquilted 7" (or the length of just one of the grids.)
  - ☐ Quilt out second pattern repeat.
  - $\square$   $^{}$  Roll back to unquilted space.




☐ <a> Go to P2P icon. Select P2P line.</a>



 $\square$   $^{}$  Using P2P line, use head of machine to carefully draw lines from point above and below grid, working from left to right.



- ☐ ♠ Click on Sew Icon and stitch out p2p lines.



☐ № Move down again, leaving 7" unquilted, repeat sewing out pattern and doing p2p line fill-in until quilt is completed.

Question: Why use p2p line to join rows of cross hatching?

Answer: It assists you in matching join points more accurately between rows.
