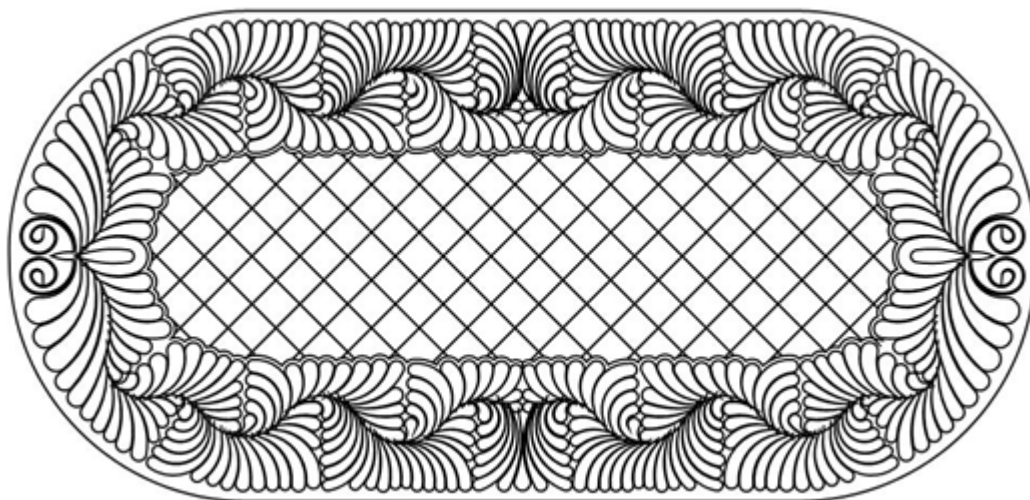




Club Notes: **Q** Moonstone OCTOBER 2023

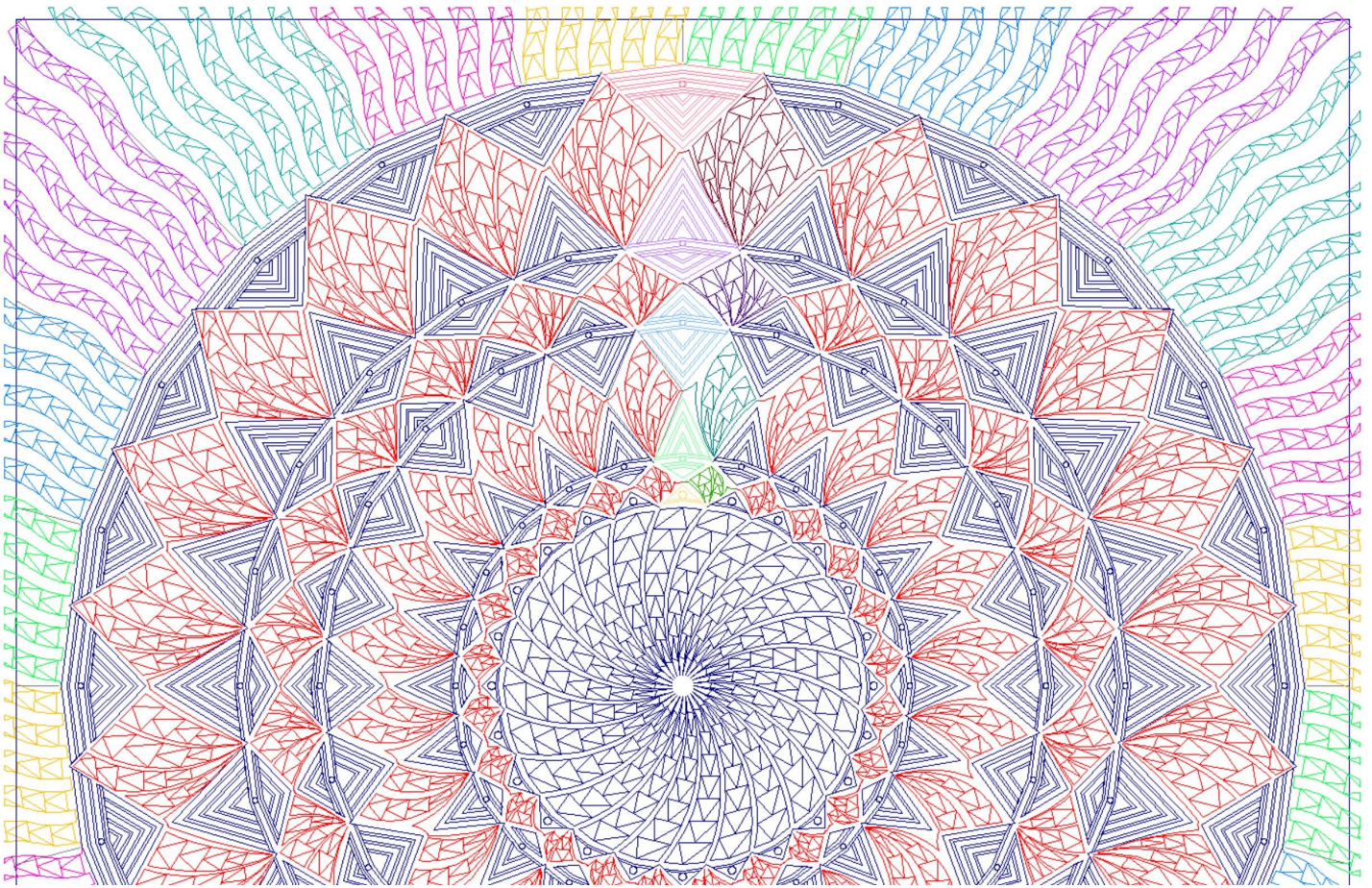
The Christmas rush is well underway, at least here in mid-Missouri. Let us know what patterns you need created for the quilts coming your way and we'll try to get them to you quickly!

Patterns for Cadence Court Quilt



Cadence Court Pattern Notes:

This is pretty dense quilting, you are going to want to take all the precautions you need to deal with shrinkage including basting.

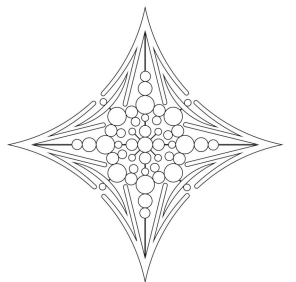
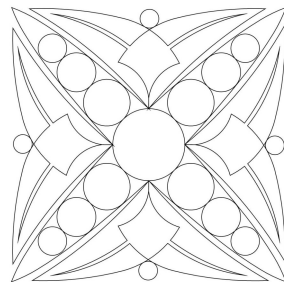
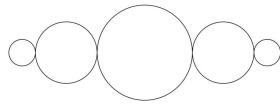
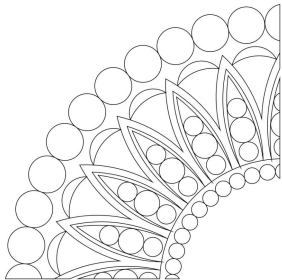
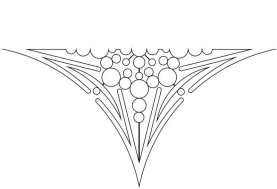
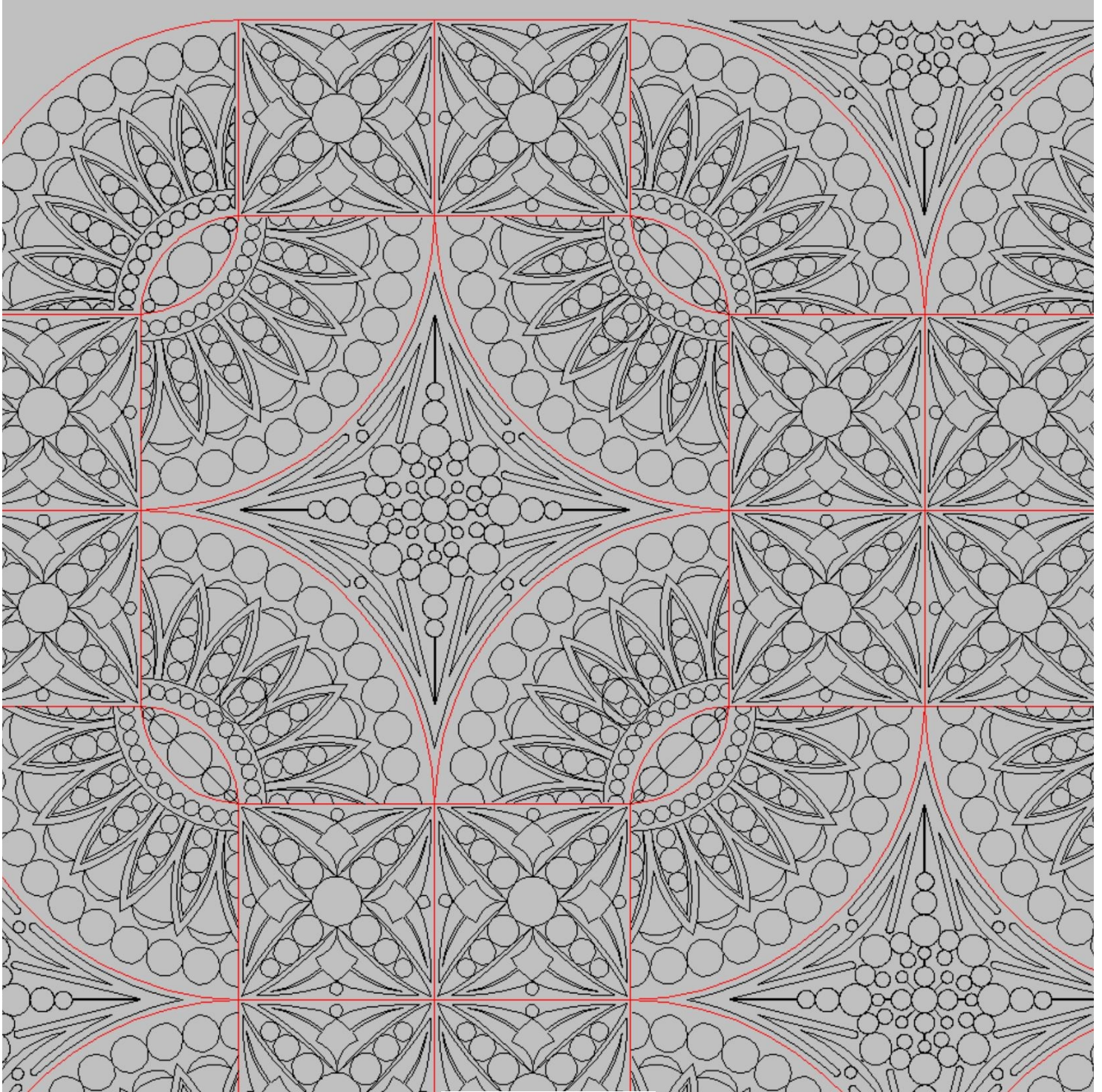
Even though these are p2p patterns, you still need to make boundaries to make sure the patterns are in the right place. Even a 1/16" of an inch in miss piecing or clicking can make enough of a difference so that the pattern will not properly get placed.

There are 2 different patterns for the pieced block. You can follow the pattern of the flying geese (although personally I think that's too busy), use the cross hatching pattern, or if you can, just ditch the piecing.

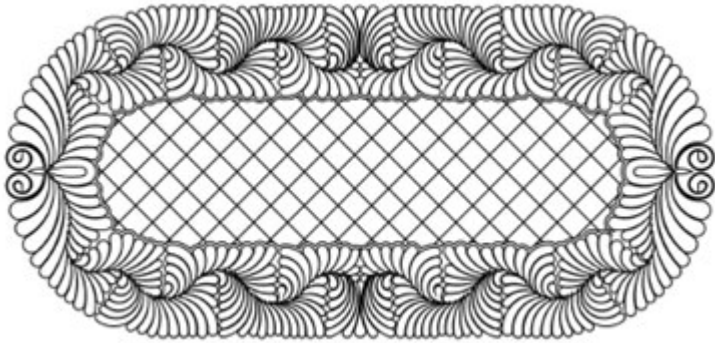
If you have a smaller throat you can use the half center pattern, quilt the first half, rotate the pattern 180 degrees, roll the quilt, and quilt the second half.

The background patterns are designed to stitch off the top fabric so be sure to carefully, baste down the edges of the top.

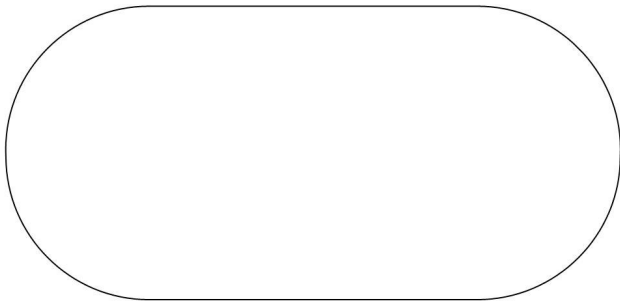
Patterns for Florid Bloom Quilt



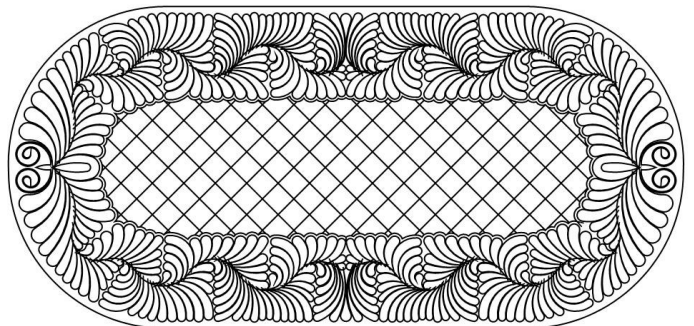
The Feather Oval Table Runner Patterns



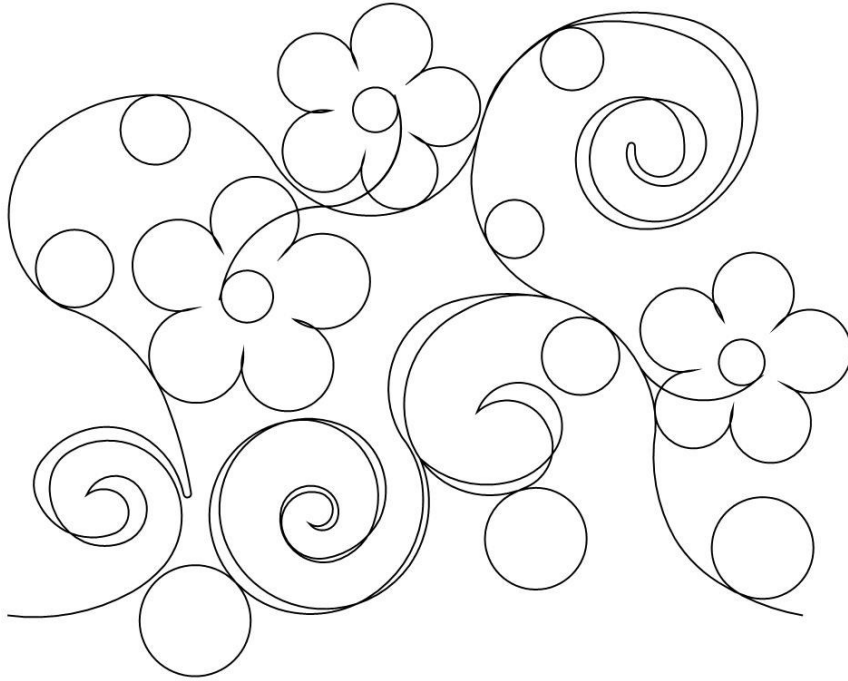
For those who have systems which don't properly handle jump stitches, Kim created "feather oval table runner 001 and 002". Just place both patterns on your cad screen, center them, and stitch out the oval outline first. This really helps control shrinkage.



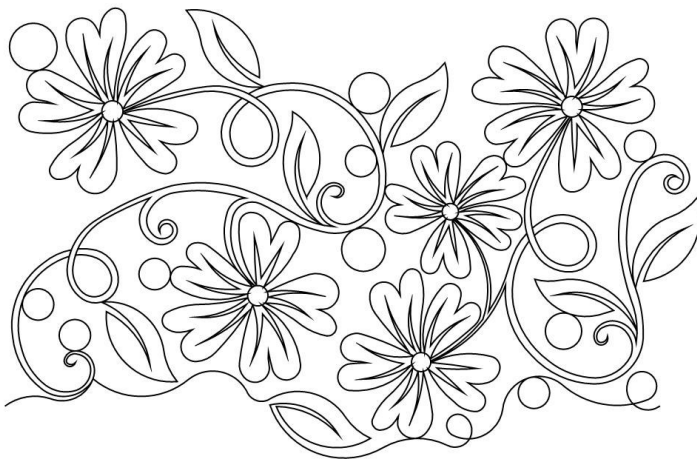
"Feather oval table runner with jumps 001" uses jump stitches to move from the oval outline to the inside feathers.

The Name Panos...sigh!

—I do my level best to talk my quilting customers OUT of stitching name panos on their quilts. Why? Because I think they almost always detract from the quilt itself AND you can't read the names from the back-side of the quilt. My personal quilting philosophy is to "do no harm" which means not quilting elaborate designs on a quilt just because I have a computer guided longarm which allows me to do so. Just because you CAN does not mean you SHOULD.

—Regardless, name panos are popular, especially around Christmas and Graduation seasons. Consequently, this archive contains more name panos than I would like. Most of them you will never have a use for, so just cull them out and forget about them. That's what I do...they don't make it onto my Statlers. If you need one, you can always ask me to send it to you again.

—Almost every single name pano started out life as a "normal" pattern, to which we were requested to add a name. The original "normal" pattern is probably NOT included in the current archive, as it was created at some time in the past. That's one reason why CJC members get a 20% discount on all online pattern purchases.

—From time to time we poll our Crown Jewels Club members and ask them if they'd like us to delete all those name panos from the archive. As Crown Jewels Club members, you pay the \$50.00 monthly fee and get EVERYTHING Kim draws...including the name panos, and apparently, you want them all. Very few people (much to my surprise) voted to have them culled out prior to release.

Statler Owners Upgrading to Creative Studio 7.3 and 7.5 (please read)

Plan your software upgrade! If you have quilts to run and cannot afford any downtime, wait until your quilt load eases up before uploading.

Some people have had better luck downloading the software to a usb stick and upgrading their Statler and their Stand Alone Mode computers from the usb stick, rather than opening the Creative Studio software and then letting it upgrade from that point.

Statler Owners: If you're using CS 7.5.4 are your encrypted patterns suddenly have a dark gold background (instead of light yellow), LOG OUT of your Creative Studio Cloud Database. Reboot your Creative Studio software and then log back into your CS Cloud Database. Your patterns should then be light yellow (which means that they will stitch). If you still have problems, sync your patterns to your Gammill Pattern Cloud Account.

If you upgrade to Statler's Ascend, Gammill will make all of your patterns (in your Gammill Pattern Cloud Account) work with your new system, but you will need to contact SDQS with your new Statler Gold Key number.
