#### Meet Your New Best Friend!

Created by Sweet Dreams Quilt Studio, Quilter's LightBox<sub>®</sub> software was designed to easily:

- Import photos of your quilt and/or quilt blocks.
- Import photos of quilt block pattern pictures.
- Preview guilting patterns superimposed over the guilt photos.
- Enlarge, reduce, copy, rotate, increase or decrease line widths, and adjust thread colors.
- Print pictures of the quilt/block with the patterns, and a list of the quilting pattern pictures used.
- Create a .zip file with all of the pictures for ease in emailing to guilt customers.

The software includes over 9000 quilting pattern pictures and free monthly updates for quilting pattern pictures. The software is available for purchase online with immediate download, and also comes with a backup version on the DVD, along with the library of pattern pictures, delivered via USPS Priority Mail. DVD is shipped within 1 business day of order date.







Pattern: austin pano 002 Archive: Pearl Count




Pattern: bird pano 003 Archive: Pearl Count








Pattern: butterfly heart pano 001


Pattern: cardinal holly pano 001 Archive: Pearl Count








#### Simple Pattern Housekeeping:

We recommend that you save all of your Sweet Dreams Quilt Studio patterns into the same folder on your system. They will then sort alphabetically and therefore be much easier to locate. For example, let's say you are looking at patterns in the Dawn series. That series spans several collections as quilters have requested variations, modifications, and block specific versions of the motifs. When they are all in the same folder, sorted alphabetically, you can easily see what you have. Double checking that list of patterns before making pattern purchases will prevent you from duplicate purchases. It will also save you the time of looking in all of the separate collections and/or archives.

I used the Quilter's LightBox software to audition patterns on this quilter's quilt. She needed a pattern for the large stair step corners and wanted feathers. Kim made the pattern (feather element 035) which is included in this archive. I chose other feather patterns and auditioned them on the various blocks, changing thread colors as needed. I printed this out as a .pdf and emailed it to our customer. She forwarded it on to her customer who loved it. Notice that the print out lists the patterns used in the layout. Because the pattern pictures come with the software already categorized, just as they are on the Sweet Dreams Quilt Studio website, it was easy to choose various patterns. I tried some feather patterns and quickly realized that they were too dense for the 4" blocks in this quilt.

Will this software work with pattern pictures from designers other than Kim Diamond? Yes! You can grab image files from the internet and use them in the program as well.

Kim made the Christmas tree skirt with burlap, and cotton fabrics (without fusible) for the applique parts. The burlap panels were then stitched together with the raw edges on the top! Kim trimmed away the batting between the layers of the burlap and just allowed the edges to fringe. Very cool looking!

The stockings were stitched on homespun fabrics and feather ticking as the background, with burlap accents. The applique on these stockings were also done without fusible. These projects both turned out really well. The applique stitch maps are included.

#### Important things to consider and include with your design request:

When you take photos of the quilt and/or quilt block, the camera should be parallel to the quilt (we need a straight on shot). If we have to draft out the block, it helps a lot to capture correct angles.

If you want an existing pattern modified, we need the exact pattern name. (We cannot modify another designer's pattern, so please don't ask us to do that.)

Style you're going for: If you want celtic, but don't tell us and we make floral, no one will be happy.

If you want a name included in the pattern, you need to double check the spelling before you submit the request. If you find out after the pattern has been designed that you requested the pattern with incorrect spelling, your submission of the correct name spelling goes to the end of the drawing list, causing a delay for you.

If your machine has a short throat, please make sure you tell us the largest amount of the fabric your machine has access to quilt. PLEASE <a href="mailto:email.org">email your design requests</a> (you can follow up with a phone call, but it helps us to have the email.)

# Favorite Longarm Supplies Vendors:

We've had many questions from new longarm quilters about the best places to buy their supplies. So, we thought we'd provide a list of our favorite vendors. This is not an exclusive list....you may already have other vendors who take care of your longarm supply needs...and we're not trying to convert anybody.

**Superior Thread:** I buy King Tut Thread in the 2000 yard cones, although they have poly thread as well. They sell wholesale only, so you'll need your sales tax certificate to set up an account. They have an amazing selection of thread. They have fabulous customer service and an easy online account set up process. **Checker Distributing:** Wholesale Only.....I have rarely looked in vain for anything quilt related on their site. Shopping for supplies can be addicting! Shipping is charged on large items, but not on items such as pins, needles, thread, books, scissors, or most other notions. They do charge shipping on bolts of fabric, luggage, cutting mats, Ott Lights, etc. <a href="http://www.checkerdist.com">http://www.checkerdist.com</a>

**SouthStar Supply Company:** They have scissors, snips & holsters, bobbins, pattern making supplies, rotary cutters, mats, knives, sharpeners, notions, needles, pins, ergonomics, safety, & handling supplies, steamers, machine oil, spot lifters, silicone.....and they are very nice people to work with.

Quilter's Dream Batting: I have pretty much stopped purchasing rolls of batting. I find it easier to maintain an accurate inventory of batting, and it stores well. Unlike some packaged batting, I don't find that the QD batting is distorted, and so it doesn't require a trip through my dryer before I can use it. Some of my best friends who also have longarm quilting businesses stock packaged batting as well as batting on a roll. **Quilted Memories:** This Hobbs Batting distributor is only a quick phone call away. She ships UPS or Fed Ex. UPS costs a bit more, but since they'll put my packages inside my garage rather than leaving it out on my front porch, I don't mind that extra cost. This lady (Lyn Heilman) makes it happen! When I find myself in a batting crunch, she's there for me! Just gotta love that!
