



Simple Pattern Housekeeping:

We recommend that you save all of your Sweet Dreams Quilt Studio patterns into the same folder on your system. They will then sort alphabetically and therefore be much easier to locate. For example, let's say you are looking at patterns in the Dawn series. That series spans several collections as quilters have requested variations, modifications, and block specific versions of the motifs. When they are all in the same folder, sorted alphabetically, you can easily see what you have. Double checking that list of patterns before making pattern purchases will prevent you from duplicate purchases. It will also save you the time of looking in all of the separate collections and/or archives.

Longarm Tip of the Month

When ordering thread for your longarm, order a minimum of two cones for each color. One cone is for the top thread and the other cone for your bobbin winder. While it is true that you can wind all of your bobbins before beginning the quilt, if you don't know how many bobbins you're going to need and you think you might run short of thread, you will waste thread removing the top thread cone repeatedly to wind bobbins.

Thread is expensive, but you must consider the value of your time as well as the value of not finding yourself stressed out over the possibility of running out of thread mid quilt. Also, if you do run out of thread, paying for expedited shipping will cost you more than the cost of the extra cone of thread.


Credit Card Housekeeping


On the first day of vacation, we used a credit card to purchase dinner at a restaurant. That transaction went through just fine. I received an email notification on my smart phone asking me to contact the fraud department of my credit card carrier. I called them, and they wanted me to verify purchases. They then told me that if I had notified them of my travel plans ahead of time, I would not have had my card declined.



I should have thought about this scenario, as we have had several Crown Jewels Club members who have had their credit card accounts frozen until the carrier could determine if the unusual activity was fraud. And then, when there actually has been fraudulent activity and they issue a new card, it's important to contact all of your recurring payment companies as soon as possible. I know that our credit card payment gateway charges Sweet Dreams Quilt Studio \$15.00 for each declined Periodic Billing Transaction. It doesn't take long for that to add up!



Important things to consider and include with your design request:

When you take photos of the quilt and/or quilt block, the camera should be parallel to the quilt (we need a straight on shot). If we have to draft out the block, it helps a lot to capture correct angles.

If you want an existing pattern modified, we need the exact pattern name. (We cannot modify another designer's pattern, so please don't ask us to do that.)


Style you're going for: If you want celtic, but don't tell us and we make floral, no one will be happy.

If you want a name included in the pattern, you need to double check the spelling before you submit the request. If you find out after the pattern has been designed that you requested the pattern with incorrect spelling, your submission of the correct name spelling goes to the end of the drawing list, causing a delay for you.

If your machine has a short throat, please make sure you tell us the largest amount of the fabric your machine has access to quilt. PLEASE email your design requests (you can follow up with a phone call, but it helps us to have the email.)

Kim had requests for border corner patterns to work with older border patterns: Are there borders for which you would like Kim to make border corner patterns? If so, email us with your list.

We've had many questions from new longarm quilters about the best places to buy their supplies. So, we thought we'd provide a list of our favorite vendors. This is not an exclusive list....you may already have other vendors who take care of your longarm supply needs...and we're not trying to convert anybody.

Superior Thread: I buy King Tut Thread in the 2000 yard cones, although they have poly thread as well. They sell wholesale only, so you'll need your sales tax certificate to set up an account. They have an amazing selection of thread. They have fabulous customer service and an easy online account set up process. They also ship internationally! <u>http://www.superiorthreads.com</u>

Checker Distributing: Wholesale Only.....I have rarely looked in vain for anything quilt related on their site. Shopping for supplies can be addicting! Shipping is charged on large items, but not on items such as pins, needles, thread, books, scissors, or most other notions. They do charge shipping on bolts of fabric, luggage, cutting mats, Ott Lights, etc. http://www.checkerdist.com

SouthStar Supply Company: They have scissors, snips & holsters, bobbins, pattern making supplies, rotary cutters, mats, knives, sharpeners, notions, needles, pins, ergonomics, safety, & handling supplies, steamers, machine oil, spot lifters, silicone....and they are very nice people to work with.

Quilter's Dream Batting: I have pretty much stopped purchasing rolls of batting. I find it easier to maintain an accurate inventory of batting, and it stores well. Unlike some packaged batting, I don't find that the QD batting is distorted, and so it doesn't require a trip through my dryer before I can use it. Some of my best friends who also have longarm quilting businesses stock packaged batting as well as batting on a roll. Quilted Memories: This Hobbs Batting distributor is only a quick phone call away. She ships UPS or Fed Ex. UPS costs a bit more, but since they'll put my packages inside my garage rather than leaving it out on my front porch, I don't mind that extra cost. This lady (Lyn Heilman) makes it happen! When I find myself in a batting crunch, she's there for me! Just gotta love that! Virginia Longarm: I buy the dress bag and the 3-sided zipper totes to deliver my quilts to customer. They bring their next quilt to me in their bag.
