Kim designed special Iron Work blocks for this quilt.








Pattern: religious pano 001


Pattern: skulls music pano 001




Williamsburg Pano SQ

She added one blank bib pattern to the collection so you can use your own creativity to customize a bib for the drooling ones among your family, friends, and customers!

Your customers can pre-order these customized bibs which they can then give as Christmas or birthday gifts. You can also use flannel backed plastic tablecloths and make bibs for preschoolers to use when finger painting. These are sizable patterns, so make them bigger if necessary. (You could even make an adult size for use on lobster night and/or for any loved ones in nursing care facilities.)
